At the beginning of the children's session we offer some support for leaders to prepare their session. This includes a consideration of how to offer provision for under 5s. Here you will find a suggestion for play materials for very young children. These are perfect for offering in a creche or a pew situation where you are keen to have provision for under 5s to help them engage with what's going on in church worship.

Children face many new beginnings that can transform their lives, e.g. learning to read, changing school. Reflecting together on the transitions those in your group have made recently may help children understand how significant this

Children's session

Gather

Wash your hands

You will need: a bowl of water, soap, towels – or this can be an imaginary activity.

Invite the children and adults to take turns to wash their hands to prepare for the session.

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Ask when they usually wash their hands. Talk about the occasions when we wash our hands and how it can mark the end of one, possibly messy, activity and preparation for a new activity, such as eating.

Stop and share

Read the story on p.10 and pause at the 3 to share these points with the children. Then use the activity to explore the passage together. (10 mins) · Remind the children that John the Baptist was Jesus' cousin.

Explore and respond

Use these ideas to help the children make connections between the Bible passage and their lives. (20 mins)

Play with bubbles

- re the difference water can make You will need: a beaker for each child; water, washing-up liquid, straws, a towel.
- Half fill each beaker with water. Offer everyone a beaker and add a squirt of washing-up liquid.
- Invite the children to describe what they can see in their beaker. Now give each child a straw and invite them to blow
- into the mixture. Discuss what changes the air has made to the mixture. Remind the group that everything changed for Jesus when he was baptized.

Create a story card reminder

You will need: copies of the template (on . , one per child, pens

- Help the children to cut out the template and fold to make doors
- that open. Talk together about the story as a new beginning for Jesus, like a door opening or a new chapter. Ask the children to draw on the outside of their door: John the Baptist on one side, and a crowd of people on the other.
- Invite the children to open their door and draw the scene of Jesus coming up out of the river in the centre, with the dove above him inside the top semi-circle.

Reflect on the change that can come with wats ou will need: Smarties^{na}, a large plate with a rim, water. Invite the children to suggest things in their lives that need God's help to change. 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These play materials are taken from an established list, created by the writers of our material for very young children. It's not an exhaustive list but it provides a wide variety. It's also not a list which every church should be expected to have straight away, but can be added to over time. It is something which is good to aim for as a church which aims to put the child in the centre.

Sensory play

- Large shallow tray and sieves, funnels, sponges, cups etc.
- Sand
- Shiny crafts items (shiny paper, sequins, shiny stickers, tinsel, ecofriendly glitter etc.)
- Balloons
- A bag or box that looks special (could easily be handmade) to use as a storybox, or to hide things in for a game
- Percussion instruments
- Child-safe mirrors
- Battery-operated tea lights and other light sources, including torches
- Ribbon, wool or string
- Play dough and tools (inc. shape cutters)
- Pots of bubbles

Fine motor skills

- Wooden building blocks
- Stacking cups
- Shape sorter
- Selection of puzzles jigsaw, lift and reveal, interlocking toys

Gross motor skills

- A play tunnel
- Hula hoop
- Soft balls and/or bean bags

Small world play

- A model church
- A Noah's ark
- A nativity set
- Dolls' house
- Toy cars and car mat
- Train set
- Toy farm set and extra toy sheep of different shapes and sizes
- Toy boats, fish and nets
- Small world people (dolls house,
- Playmobil, Happyland etc.)

Creative play

- Play food, cups, plates, pans
- Plastic plant pots and toy gardening equipment
- Dolls and teddies
- Toy doctor's kit
- Dressing up items particularly nativity costumes, crowns etc.
- Toy treasure, coins, jewels
- Hand and finger puppets





Using ROOTS in church worship (creche and pew)

A story with simple actions

Share the Word

A version of the story for very young children.

Teach the children some simple actions for: 'come and follow' and 'come and see.'

When Jesus was just beginning his work on earth, he asked some people to come and follow him. One day, he met Philip. 'Come and follow me!' he said, so Philip followed Jesus. Philip went to tell his friend, Nathanael, 'We have found the man who was promised to us, come and see!' Nathanael wasn't so sure, but he went with Philip. He realised Jesus was the special one who had been promised. so Jesus invited Nathanael to come and follow them too. 'Come and follow me!' he said.

to do with their parents. They are simple, usually only require a small amount of 'kit' and can really help children of this age to be part of what their parents and carers are experiencing in worship.

Simple activities to play, create and pray

🐻 Wipe-away drawings

Play and wonder about God's forgiveness

Provide some chalkboards or wipe-clean boards for the children to make marks on, and then wipe them away.

Jesus is special

Create artwork to mark Jesus' authority

Write the word 'Jesus' in large bubble letters on a large roll of paper. Lay it out between the children and invite them to work together, using special things (e.g. collage materials, sparkly stickers, shiny papers and gemstones) to decorate it.


🐻 Pray with play dough

Give each child a lump of play dough. Invite them to make one thing then squash it and make something new.





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The ROOTS activity sheet is perfect for under 5s to use in the pew as they contain a colouring picture, as well as other simple activities which often under 5s are able to engage with as well. This example (which can be downloaded from our website) shows a simple colouring picture, another picture which could be coloured in or drawn into as the activity suggests and a finger labyrinth which the children can follow. The parents could also write for the children as they talk together about words to thank God for, beginning with each letter of the word 'light' – a perfect way for parents/carers to work together in worship with their under 5s.
